SAFETY - Rider Education

A New Commitment

Just what you want to hear this time of year, right? One more commitment. But this one is really important – it is a commitment to Rider

Education. Many of us are already involved in the GWRRR Rider Education Levels Program and it is so easy to do. For the first level – Level 1 – Safety by Commitment – that is all you have to do. Make a commitment to ride safely, see me to help you fill out some simple paperwork, and send it off with a nominal amount of money (\$6.00) and you are in. I'll bet that once you get started you won't be able to stop and you will find yourself attending an ERC course, Medic First/Aid CPR course or some other seminar to improve your riding and safety skills. Next thing you know you will qualify for Level II, then Level III and ultimately Level IV – Master Tour Rider. This program is the heart and soul of what GWRRR stands for – Rider Education - and GWRRR provides the tools to help us become the best riders we can be. Don't forget that if you are currently in the Levels Program, you need to renew your current level by January 1st. Give me a call (385-4556) if you have any questions about how to do this or see me at the next meeting. We had a lot of people progress upward this year, which means that they have seen the value of the program and understand how important it can be. So, make a new commitment for 2004 – renew or join in on the Levels Program.

The weather has definitely turned more season-like and not many of us are riding these days. So, this is a great time to catch up on some reading. There are lots of very good books available on the art of motorcycling and maybe one would make a good stocking stuffer. Or another good gift might be a subscription to a new riding magazine. These are great riding resources – ask Butch Royse. You can never have too many magazine subscriptions about motorcycles.


