An occasional sprinkle of rain kept us company but did not dampen our enthusiasm. Chuck Gegge, Jim Pennington and I enjoyed a great ride but the skies were getting darker and we decided to cut it short just after lunch. Just as we crossed the river back

Rider Education

Time to Get Polished



This is the time of year when most of us are all excited about riding after a long winter break. Just like the bike that has been sitting in the garage getting dusty, our riding skills have definitely fallen out of practice over the long winter. After you are done polishing the debris from your bike, change the oil, check the air in your tires, and double-check the bike's other fluid levels. To help you remember what to check; the MSF came up with the acronym T-CLOCK, which stands for Tires, Controls Lights, Oil, Chassis and Kickstand. A T-CLOCK inspection works great for making sure the bike is ready to ride. Then take the time to go to a parking lot and polish your riding maneuvers as well. It's been a long time since we have had to swerve or do a quick stop. Motorists are not looking for us on the roads these days so you never know when a little driving practice might help you be mentally ready for your next evasive maneuver. I am happy to report that our upcoming ERC scheduled for May 8th at Diamond Oaks is full. These people have made the commitment to polish their riding skills for 2004.

Don't forget to polish up your riding gear too. Check it for cuts, scratches, abrasions and general wear and tear. Get it clean and replace what can't be fixed or is just not in good condition anymore. It is very important to replace your riding gloves – especially the ones you wear when you ride in hot weather. These hold bacteria and if you should ride with a cut on your hand you can get a very serious infection. As I remember Butch Royse had this happen to him not too many years ago. Gloves need to be washed or replaced on a regular basis.

If you ride with a full-face helmet or an open face helmet with a visor, check the visor for scratches. Even a small scratch can affect your ability to see properly, especially at night or in the rain. It is cheap to get a new one and you just might be amazed at the difference it makes in what you can see on the road.

SKILLS DAY Another way to get ready is to attend

an upcoming Skills Day. A Skills Day event is an opportunity to practice your riding on a closed course with a bunch of your Goldwing

friends. A local chapter who makes sure there is food available hosts it. There is a practice course set up and you can go through the course to improve your skills. There is no grade – it is not like an ERC but is meant to be fun and informative at the same time. The Skills Day event in our area this year will be on **May 16th** in Xenia, OH at Route 42 & Ledbetter Road (southeast of Xenia) and will be hosted by Chapter J (those rowdy “pink” shirted people). It starts at 10:00 AM and will end at 2:00 PM. Please try to attend this very worthwhile and FREE event.

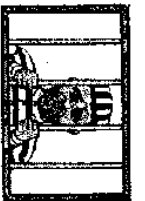
