Chapter Historian

History just keeps on happening. One of the things that I have to let you know about this month is the passing of a former member of Chapter L and my old riding buddy Denny Hahn.



Denny, who was 63, passed away on February 3, 2004 after fighting for over 17 years with health problems. In January 1987, Denny's pancreas ruptured and that put him in the hospital for many months. After spending a great deal of time in the hospital back then, he fought with diabetes and heart problems and yet continued having a smile on his face much of the time. As soon as he recovered enough he was riding again.

Denny was always clowning around and when he put one over on you ... you laughed. Around the early '90's, Denny and his wife Linda moved from Ohio over to Indiana. Several years ago, Denny held the honor of being the last Area Representative of Indiana G-2 and the first Chapter Director of Indiana G-2.

At one point he and Linda decided to make "Clowning Around" a theme for their involvement with GWRRA. Denny & Linda were riding a 1990 Gold Wing that they had painted a circus theme with the circus wagons on the saddlebags. They would go to various GWRRA events and rallies and make people laugh while accentuating the "FRIENDS for FUN" in GWRRA's motto.

I am really glad that I introduced them to GWRRA. They had so much fun making people laugh as Denny was "Bibbs" in full clown costume and Linda

was "Tootsie" when they went to rallies and watched people smile when they were "zinged" by an expert.

Denny and I had ridden a fair number of miles together over the twenty-plus years that I knew him and I know that I am going to really miss him.

In reality, we rode the last mile together. Diabetes had affected his eyesight and he wrecked his motorcycle in California in 2000 after we had left Wing Ding in Billings. More friends were found in California when I pulled out the Gold Book and Brenda called the Chapter Director of the local GWRRA Chapter near the accident site. Bill and Neddie Libby were there to look after Denny and Linda while Brenda and I made a very sad return trip home. This accident was the first one for him and the one that ended Denny's 45 years of riding.

In an extended reality, another close friend J.D. Largent and I were there with Linda and daughters when Denny passed from this life.

Remember, when you meet another motorcycle rider, it could end up being one of your closest friends. It did for me!

2004 Chapter "L" Couple

It was an honor for us to be asked to be the Chapter Couple for Ohio Chapter L. After being asked over a year ago and with a lot of consideration we finally said yes for a number of reasons.

This month I will go into the number one reason why we accepted your Chapter Director's request to do this.

I feel reason number one is a dedication to GWRRA. We are now into our twentieth year of membership in a fine organization and one that we are definitely proud to be a part of. Kathy Peck. 1987 was the final year for GWRRA's Queen Status. In fact, Kathy Peck had gone through the competition at State level and was Ohio Queen, Region D Queen and went on

to WingDing for that competition in Knoxville, Tennessee. Kathy was not chosen as WingDing Queen but Chapter L came out in support of her in big numbers.

Pardon me while I digress a bit ... Brenda and I were Area Representatives (now called Chapter Directors) at the time and we had so many members pre-register for Wing Ding that our Chapter down in the southwestern part of Ohio won the award for "Largest Chapter in Attendance." Chapter L was very large at that time and Brenda and I fully supported plans to branch out and start two new chapters in the greater Cincinnati area. This happened in the fall of 1987 when Chapter A-1 and E-1 (later changed to A-2 and E-2) kicked off to keep members from the north and east sides of Cincinnati from traveling so far to a meeting.

In 1988, GWRRA changed the program to reflect the "Couple of the Year" instead of Queen. Over the years and since that time, anyone who participated in the program ended up being a proud member of the GWRRA Chapter in which they participated. Looking back to Chapter L branching out and forming new chapters, it seems that I remember that A-2 was producing members in great numbers that X-2 kicked off over 11 years ago. And the beat goes on!

As I sit here and write this, this article is already late to get to the editor, so let me end with that for this time. We do plan to get around to as many local GWRRA chapter events as we can, just to prove that we still can.

AMA REACTS TO JANKLOW SENTENCE

PICKERINGTON, Ohio -- The American Motorcyclist Association (AMA) reports that former U.S. Rep. Bill Janklow (R-SD), who was convicted December 8, 2003, of second-degree manslaughter and three other counts related to a traffic crash that claimed the life of a Minnesota motorcyclist, was sentenced today to 100 days in the Minnehaha County Jail. Janklow will not have to spend time in the South Dakota State Penitentiary, and he could be eligible for a work-release program after 30 days in jail.

On Saturday, August 16, motorcyclist Randolph Scott of Hardwick, Minnesota was killed in a collision with a car driven by Janklow. The fatal crash took place at the intersection of two county roads in eastern South Dakota. Reports released by investigators indicated that Janklow's car, traveling at speeds estimated at more than 70 mph, did not stop at the stop sign and continued into the path of the motorcycle, giving the rider no chance to avoid the fatal collision.

Janklow's resignation from the U.S. House of Representatives took effect on January 20, 2004.

"The AMA is extremely disappointed with this sentence," said Edward Moorland, AMA Vice President for Government Relations. "This South Dakota court has handed down a judicial insult to motorcyclists nationwide, and to the memory of Randolph Scott, the motorcyclist who paid the price for Mr. Janklow's criminal conduct."

According to a recent Associated Press review of South Dakota court records dating back to 1989, 80 percent of those convicted of second-degree manslaughter have been sent to jail or prison. Average jail time was six months, and the average prison term was almost seven years.

In the days following the accident, the AMA called on motorcyclists nationwide to contact South Dakota Gov. Mike Rounds and Attorney General Larry Long, urging them to seek justice in the case.

Using AMA Rapid Response, motorcyclists and other concerned citizens can send e-mail messages directly to South Dakota officials. AMA Rapid Response, which allows users to contact lawmakers, government officials and the media with the click of a button, is available on the Association's website, AMADirectlink.com.

The AMA notes that tragic crashes like the one involving Janklow, in which a car or other vehicle violates the right of way of a motorcycle, are all too common on the nation's highways. The most comprehensive study ever conducted into motorcycle accidents found that nearly 75 percent of motorcycle accidents involve another vehicle, and that in almost two-thirds of those crashes, the cause could be traced to the other vehicle violating the motorcyclist's right-of-way.

For more than a year, the AMA has been involved in a campaign called Motorcyclists Matter that focuses attention on the dangers faced by motorcyclists and other vulnerable road users, including bicyclists and pedestrians, as a result of drivers who violate their right-of-way. The Association is also campaigning in Washington, D.C., for funding for a new study into the causes of motorcycle accidents -- the first in more than two decades.

The American Motorcyclist Association, founded in 1924, is a non-profit organization with more than 260,000 members. The Association's purpose is to pursue, protect and promote the interests of motorcyclists, while serving the needs of its
