## Rider Education



### Booby Traps

Did you ever play the game Booby-Trap®? If I did I don't remember but Pat told me all about it. The object of the game was to win as many points as possible by removing colored playing pieces from the game board without allowing the spring bar to move that held them in place. Each player had the opportunity to "pass" when they thought that their move might cause the spring bar to shift, but eventually each person would have to take a turn.

There are a lot of similarities between riding on motorcycles and playing that game. When riding we can definitely encounter booby traps but the only difference is we don't get the chance to "pass." Every time we ride the roads are full of potential booby traps just waiting to spring out on us. Road surfaces have potholes, bumps, loose gravel, edge traps, grated bridges, shiny steel plates, slick railroad crossings, and spilled fuel. Streets might twist and turn just as we are supposed to cross a railroad track or as we are enjoying that great twisty back road; all of a sudden there is gravel in the next turn. Often when we are traveling we are used to the way streets are marked in our own neighborhood but when out of town the highway officials have a whole different way of letting us know where we are or

where we should be to get ready for our next turn. Have you even approached an intersection only to have the stop sign hidden by overhanging bushes?

As experienced riders, we know we need to allow for these kinds of booby traps. Each time we might “pass” and not be ready for them, they will sneak up on us and catch us when we least expect it. That is when disaster can strike. I know I have become a bit more conservative in my riding the older I get to allow more time to assess the road ahead just a little farther than I used to. Sometimes booby traps can even occur when you are sitting still. Have you ever been stopped behind a vehicle only to have them put the car in reverse instead of drive? If you are stopped too close to them you have no way of escape and have basically created a booby trap for yourself. Sometimes following too closely to the car or truck in front of you doesn’t allow you the forward vision to see that hole in the road or truck tire alligator waiting to take you down. When we are

riding on two wheels without the stability of four and the protection of that steel box around

us, we just need to be more aware of our surroundings and allow for the inevitable booby traps we will encounter.

Attention all trike riders! A Trike Rider Course (TRC) has been scheduled for August 21, 2004, at Triway High School in Wooster, OH. The class will begin at 8:00 AM and last until approximately 3:30 PM, including a lunch break. The cost is \$30.00 per trike and co-riders are welcome to participate with no additional cost. Registrations will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis and must be submitted to Dave McElderry along with a check made payable to “GWRRA of Ohio.” Full details and registration instructions are contained in the registration form, which may be downloaded from the link on the Region D Rider Ed page, or downloaded directly from:

1 box Duncan Hines yellow cake mix

undrained

Mix all of the ingredients together with an electric mixer. I like to kick it up a notch by adding a second can of Mandarin Oranges, however drain the second can and drink the juice.

Divide the mixture into three 9" cake pans and bake at 350 degrees for 15 minutes or until the broom straw comes out clean.

1 - 3oz package of instant vanilla pudding  
12oz container of Cool Whip

Mix the instant pudding into the crushed pineapple. Fold in the Cool Whip and ice the cake.
