Rider Education

I hope you all enjoyed determining your personal Risk Assessment Profile at last month's meeting. It can be a

real eye-opener to actually sit down and look at how you ride and how that affects personal risk on the bike. I bet most of us fell into the category of “moderate” or “least” risk especially since most of us wear a helmet all the time and also wear full coverage riding gear. I know that Cris is walking proof of the protection that gear designed for motorcycle riding can have. New riding gear just might be a good thing to put on your holiday shopping list.

This time of year also means that for some the riding season is coming to an end. We all have to make the decision – do we winterize the bike and put it up or do we keep it ready for that mid-winter ride when the sun is out and the temperature is just right? I didn't get to ride nearly as much this year as I normally do, so I will be holding out for one of those sunny days still ahead. When the bike sits for a bit it is even more important to perform a T-CLOCK check before riding. So just what the heck is T-CLOCK anyway? It is an acronym that the Motorcycle Safety Foundation came up with to help us remember the important things to check every time we plan to ride.

It stands for:

- Tires and wheels
- Controls and cables
- Lights
- Oil and fuel
- Chassis
- Kickstand and centerstand

I will have a T-CLOCK checklist available at the meeting. The information on this list may also serve as a reminder of the things that we need to have taken care of by our dealer and now would be a good time to do it instead of waiting until March or April when dealer wait times can be long and the last place we want our bike to be is in the shop. So, consider this a reminder from your friendly rider educator so you will be prepared and ready to go.

Don't forget that if you ride a GL1800 you absolutely must wash your wheels after taking a ride on roads that have been previously salted. The dust left

behind on the roads will collect on the rims after even the shortest ride and can do significant damage to the aluminum wheels if not cleaned off.

One more thing – please see me at the meeting if you need the forms to renew your Rider Education Levels. This paperwork must be submitted by January 1st. If you have some additional safe riding miles, have attended a rider course, Medic/First Aid course, etc., you may just qualify for the next level and not even know it. Renew your commitment to safe riding by staying current in the Levels Program.

I also want to say “thanks” to the guys who accompanied me on this year’s stag ride. I think everyone enjoyed the new route and the hotels worked out great. Thanks so much to the following manly, well-adjusted, safety-conscience, courteous men who took part: Roy Williams, Carl Hauser, Bill Halm, Steve Albert, Bud Smith, Tom McKiernan, Ron Bien, Dave Finke, Mike Watzek, Butch Royse, Rick Harless, and Jeff Weddle. It was a great time and I personally can’t wait to go next year.

Gold Wing Recipe Review

Here is a great starter for that Fat Tuesday homage to epicurean self-indulgence. This could also be a meal, but why stop there. The sausages can be found at some of the vendors at Findley Market or Avril's on Court Street downtown. Tell Ralph that I sent you.

For the shrimp you can take the easy way out by getting it at SAM's, pre-cooked, peeled and tailless. Be sure it is thawed and add it for about five minutes before serving. Of course if you do this you will lose a little of the flavor given off by the shells and heads. For my personal taste this recipe needs to be kicked up several notches by increasing the amount of cayenne pepper. An option is to have a jug of hot sauce on the table.

Cajun and/or Zydeco music blaring in the background while cooking and consuming is entirely appropriate.



Bon Appetit!

Gumbo

2lbs. Creole (Andouille) sausage sliced or cubed
2c chopped onion
2/3c chopped green pepper
1/2c scallion tops
2T fresh parsley
1T minced garlic
2-3lbs. Chicken (whatever you like)
2lbs. Shrimp

Roux

2/3c vegetable oil
2/3c flour

Liquid & Seasonings

2qt. Water
3-1/2t salt
1-1/4t ground pepper
1/8t cayenne powder
1t dried thyme
3 crushed bay leaves
3T File powder



Gold Wing Recipe Review cont.

Brown chicken in oil. Remove chicken and add flour to make Roux. Cook until nut brown while stirring frequently. Add sausage & veggies. Cook 10 minutes. Add 1/4c water, chicken & seasonings (except File). Add rest of water bring to boil and simmer 45 minutes. Add shrimp and cook for 8 minutes. Remove pot from heat, add File powder, and let stand for 5 minutes. Serve over rice.
