Remember, this is a family event and friends and family are welcome. We will never reveal the recipe of your chili or anyone else's, for that matter. In fact if you have never participated in the chili dump, we encourage you to do so and see why everyone has been bragging about the taste of our chili. Hope you are able to come out. October 16<sup>th</sup> is when it all happens!

Recent history of September 2004 has provided some of us R & R (Retired and Riding) members of GWRRA a great early fall ride. On September the 27<sup>th</sup>, we had 5 Gold Wings, 2 HD's and 1 Kaw Concours wind down to and through Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia and North Carolina for a four-day ramble on some very scenic roads in those states. Following me on the Gold Wings were Judy Wyckoff, Bob Strout, Elmer Jauch, Milt Bridges, Paul Lowe (Kaw), Al Rolfes (HD), Ed Packard (HD). As we pulled into Bristol, VA/TN and were checking into our motel two other members of our R & R group, riding Gold Wings, and who had been to Wings Over the Smokies, rolled in. They were Chester Riddle and Marvin Littrell. Chester and Marvin had been having fun at W.O.S. and had contacted me via cell phone to get details of our motel location.

Let me tell you that we may be retired but we still love riding. Judy had contacted the Tennessee

District Director, Tom Jarrell and let him know we were in town. We met up with Tom Jarrell on Tuesday morning and he rode down US 421 with us to breakfast in Shady Valley, TN. Chester and Marvin decided since it was raining that they had better head for home. By not going with us they missed two things ... rain and a great ride! Getting back to Tuesday morning, we spent an enjoyable breakfast with Tom and then after saying our good-byes to Tom, I put an evasive plan into action. This one guy, called Ivan, altered my original plans. We had the remnants of the tropical storm dump a little rain on my projected route and that closed some of the roads we planned to ride. It was still raining so I devised a route to the west and that took us out of the rain ... we went down Route 93 rerouting over to 19E and eventually into Maggie Valley. Several of us went to the Wheels Through Time Museum on Tuesday and then later we experienced some great twisty roads.

On Wednesday we discovered a beautiful day to ride. Reviewing the road closures (from our evil adversary Ivan) a beautiful route to follow was planned and followed from Waynesville (near Maggie Valley) over Route 276, to Brevard and then west on US 64 over to Highlands and into Franklin where we picked up Rt 28. This road has excellent pavement and an unbelievable array of twisties. We followed this road to Deals Gap, then Rt 129 to Robbinsville and then the Cherohala Skyway to Tellico Plains and Sweetwater. Leaving Sweetwater, Elmer had a flat and that terminated the planned route home. After the tire problem was repaired, we headed north under unbelievably blue skies.

We are looking for more good days to ride before limiting our riding season with winter chills and a little bit of bad weather. When I returned to the point of beginning I checked my GPS and it said the trip was 1,160 miles of smiles. I want to thank everyone who made this an enjoyable ride. Yesterday is history. Tomorrow is a mystery. Today is a gift. That's why it's called the present! Life is short, ... time to find some longer roads.

## RALLIES AND CONCIERGE

We don't have any rally or concierge information this month but we do have a joke for you: *Knock knock. Who's there? Ivan. Ivan who? Ivan idea, lets go to New Orleans!* That's about how it all started for Diane and me and the three other couples who left

with us on Sunday, September 12 for New Orleans. That's also about how it all ended, but we'll get to that later. Ed Packard picked out a route to exclude all expressways and to make sure we rode the Natchez Trace on the way. So around 7:15 a.m. we left McDonald's in Greendale, In. with our target for the day being Tupelo, Mississippi. It was a beautiful day and the riding was fun and easy. Just before we picked up the Trace outside Nashville, we got some light rain, so we pulled in to a gas station to gear and gas up. By the time we left the station the rain has subsided and we got right on the ramp at mile marker 444 of the Natchez Trace.

If you ever want to really "get away" and out on the open road, this road is for you. No commercial traffic, hardly any cars, no utility poles or wires, no houses, cows, horses or any other sign of civilization. Except for the occasional wild turkeys, deer or points of historical interest, many consider this to be a boring and weary ride. After a while, we stopped at Meriwether Lewis' grave and discussed whether to try to make Tupelo or find the nearest town and call it a day. After twelve hours on the road, Tupelo was still over 100 miles to the south and it was nearly dark. We were split over the decision. If we made Tupelo, we would have more time later to visit Elvis and to see more of Natchez, so we called ahead and made reservations in Tupelo. After resuming the ride, we noticed one more thing the Trace has none of – streetlights. The rain started again, this time with lots of lightning. The boredom was gone and I think we wanted it back. In such darkness, it's amazing how bright the lightning can be. It was quite a show but also a little scary.

We pulled into our motel at 9:15 p.m., thankful and ready for a warm shower and dry sheets. We had just covered 580 miles and six states in one day! Up early the next day, we visited the home of Elvis for a while and headed back to the Trace and on for 220 more miles to Natchez. At mile marker 0, we exited the Trace and were soon in Natchez. Our motel was on top of a hill overlooking the Mississippi River toward Louisiana. While in Natchez, we took a bus tour and visited a couple of antebellum homes. Natchez was the first settlement on the Mississippi, even before New Orleans. At a fish restaurant just across the river, we met some nice folks from New Orleans, who were running for their lives from Hurricane Ivan! We decided to change our plans and head north and west instead of south and east. New Orleans was closed!

After two nights in Natchez, we headed for Hot Springs, Arkansas. The great weather continued for

us, in fact it might have been a little too warm at 97 degrees. After 350 miles of cotton fields, we pulled into a Best Western, which had a marquee welcoming Ivan refugees. It was filled but we had called ahead and got in. While there, we toured the town and a bathhouse, which is actually the smallest National Park in the US. The highlight of our stay in Hot Springs was a dinner cruise on a beautiful lake called Lake Hamilton. To make it even more special, everyone surprised Diane Hart with a card and nice lighthouse gift for her birthday.

After two nights in Hot Springs, we picked up route 9 and headed north and east. There is some great riding in northern Arkansas as you get into the Ozarks. At the Missouri line, we stopped at a visitor's center in Mammoth Spring, Ak., to view the lake created by a dam for a century old power station, with the water coming from a large spring. We then continued east through southern Missouri to Sikeston for the night. We heard about Lambert's restaurant in Sikeston, where they serve massive amounts of food and throw fresh rolls at you. We saw for ourselves how a guy with tongs could flip rolls from twenty feet away and consistently hit outstretched hands with precision. While you ate, servers would come around with buckets of side dishes in case you didn't get enough to start with.

After one night in Sikeston, we continued on our way home. We crossed the Mississippi into Illinois and stopped at the park there at the junction of the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers. Our last leg took us back into Kentucky, north across the river at Evansville, In., then north to US 50 and east toward Cincinnati. We had 2100 miles of great back road riding through a total of nine states and lots of fun with good friends. Diane and I are glad to have shared this trip with Butch and Betty Royse, John and Carla Luebbe, and Ed and Diane Packard, who were our leaders. If you want to know about New Orleans, don't ask me because I've never been there.

This is "changing of the guard" season so to speak and as of October 1, 2004 someone new will be leading the Rider Ed.

function for the Ohio district. Congratulations to Cliff Basel who will now be Ohio's District Educator (many of us met Cliff when he was here helping his wife, Carol, with our Medic/First Aid class and AED training). We are looking forward to Cliff's leadership continuing the tradition of Ohio leading the way in Rider Education.

I would also like to extend my personal "thanks for a job well done" to Dave Taylor who, for the last 4 ½ years, served Ohio as our District Educator. Rider Education has grown significantly in Ohio under Dave's watch and I know all of us, as riders, are better off for it. Thanks, Dave!

There was some interesting information included in September's Rider Education newsletter that I would like to share here. First, there is a new patch available to co-riders who complete the Road Captain's course. A "Co-Road Captain" rocker is now available through our District and/or Region Educators for any co-rider who has completed the course, including the road ride segment. See me if you have any questions.

The Rider Education Handbook was updated recently and will be undergoing another revision shortly. One change will affect new applicants for the Level IV, Master Tour Rider Program. In the

past, new applicants mailed their form directly to the home office in Phoenix. For future applicants to the Master program, all applications must be sent to the Sr. Region D Educator, Dave McElderry, 412 Lincoln Avenue, Lima, OH 45805, for review and approval. Dave will validate that the member has completed the minimum 1-year as Level III and has 25,000 safe miles accumulated and on record. After review, the form will be forwarded to Phoenix. This change goes into effect immediately.

Don't forget that all participation in the Rider Ed. Levels program (except for Level I) needs to be renewed at the beginning of each new

year and requires the completion and submission of the appropriate renewal form. Please see me for the forms or pick one up from the information table at the back of the room at the meeting. With the riding season winding down, this is a good time to check what you have accomplished and see if you qualify to move up in the ranks of Rider Education. See me for more information.

One more thing – if you have access to a computer, and would like to take an MSF (Motorcycle Safety Foundation) challenge, go to this site:

It will help you brush up on your knowledge and have some fun.

I am really looking forward to this year's Stag Ride, which will be concluded by the time you read this. There are 14 manly, well-adjusted, safety-conscience, courteous men from Chapter L, A2, and X2 who will be straightening out some of the twisty Kentucky, Tennessee and Virginia roads. The Stag Ride Oath of secrecy will be administered to all newcomers to protect the reputations of all riders.

I will be sharing some wonderful recipes you can try before Ash Wednesday arrives. While living on the Gulf coast for a number of years we found a lot of great dining and recipes that have Cajun & Creole flavors. You might want to combine all of these recipes into a Fat Tuesday blowout. Let the good times roll!



## Chicken Jambalaya

2T oil  
3-4lbs. Chicken (We cut up chicken breasts)  
4c chopped onion  
3/4c green pepper  
3/4c scallion tops  
1T minced garlic  
4T fresh parsley  
1/2lb. Baked ham  
1lb. Lean pork in cubes  
6 links Creole sausage  
3-1/2t salt  
1/2t ground pepper  
1/4t cayenne  
1/2t chili powder  
2 crushed bay leaves  
1/4t dried thyme  
1/8t ground cloves  
1/4t dried basil  
1/8t mace  
2c rice  
4c water

Brown chicken & pork in oil. Remove and set aside. Cook veggies, ham and sausage with all of the herbs and spices. Add chicken and pork and water and rice. Bring to boil and simmer until rice is cooked.


