Rider Education

This is the time of year when a lot of riders have had the opportunity to put a lot of miles on their tires over the riding

season so far. If you are in the market for a new set of tires, do you know what the tire identification codes on the tires you purchase mean? The National Traffic Safety Administration approved changes to the regulation that requires the date of manufacture in the tire identification number on the side of the tire to now be four digits instead of three.

The new DOT serial number format is:

W2HLABC0501, which broken down means:

W2 – Plant Code

HL – Size Code

ABC – Option Code

0501 – Date Manufactured

When you purchase tires at a rally or from an on-line discounter, check these codes to make sure you are getting a "new" tire. That fresh rubber is the only thing between the street and us.

Did you know that if you are parking your bike on a really windy day or during a storm with high winds you should not use your centerstand? Three points of contact are much more stable so using your sidestand is the smarter thing to do. Try to position the bike so that the sidestand is in the lee (the sheltered side) of the wind. And if you have a choice of putting the bike in a head-on position to the wind versus a tail-on, choose head-on. Your bike is aerodynamic from the front, not the rear and your

windshield could act as a good parasail to catch the wind and cause the bike to move or possibly fall over.

Stag riders - have you completed a your "honey do" lists yet? You know

you don't want a thing like that to keep you from going on this year's stag ride. Be sure all the things are done on your list and don't get in any trouble between now and October 8th-10th so you can go with us on a ride through eastern Kentucky. I will have more details next month but please mark your calendars for this year's Chapter L Stag Ride. I will have a sign-up sheet at the meeting so please sign up or give me a call to let me know you would like to go so I know how many hotel rooms to reserve. Thanks, guys.

I am looking forward to seeing everyone at our next gathering on September 15th. And don't forget to make a personal commitment to Rider Education!

Gold Wing Recipe Review

This recipe is for the folks who are counting "carbs." So yummy! Be sure and use the "fatted" cheese, dry Ranch Dressing, mayo and sour cream. If you don't have any Won-Ton wrappers in your freezer, you can put the concoction on celery or other pieces of crudités. As a matter of fact, those little Won-Ton wrappers might be filled with carbs. Give those to the folks on Weight Watchers. Bon Appetit!

Stuffed Won-Ton Stars

1-1oz package Ranch dressing mix
1c real mayonnaise
1c sour cream
1# hot & spicy bulk sausage
1-16oz package of Won-Ton wrappers
1-2.25oz can sliced black olives
1 bunch green onions chopped
1 red pepper diced
3c shredded Cheddar cheese

Mix Ranch dressing mix, real mayonnaise & sour cream. Let sit for 1 hour. Meanwhile, lightly spray muffin pas with nonstick cooking spray. Line muffin tins with Won-Ton wrappers. Bake 5-7 minutes at 375 or until golden brown. Gently remove and let cool. Brown sausage and drain well on paper towels. Mix sausage, drained black olives, green onions, red pepper, cheese & mayonnaise mixture. Stuff Won-Ton wrappers with filling and bake at 375 for an addition 5-7 minutes or until cheese melts.


