As you may know we just came back from the fall officers meeting in Columbus. I'd like to touch on the highlights. The biggest news is that our chapter couple did well in the competition and will be competing again at Cabin Fever in February. We were very proud of **Bud & Peg Smith!**

Other news from GWRRA National, Regional and Ohio District includes:

The Rider Ed. Levels Program has undergone some revisions. The biggest is that renewal fees are now being dropped for all levels. You can opt to receive the year pin for \$2.00 each. Level 4 renewal reminder letters will no longer be sent by GWRRA. You must renew all levels by January 1<sup>st</sup> each year.

Rider Ed. Statistics are no longer being accepted from the newsletter and must be sent directly to the District Educator.

The Region D Rally will be held in Lebanon Indiana this year with the date moving to August 31 – Sept 3 (Labor Day weekend). Life members will no longer receive the 50% discount on registration.

The Fun Shop training session, usually held in late winter, is being dropped in favor of more local editions of the Horizons program. Chapter L will sponsor a Horizons program sometime in 2006.

National has announced that modifications are under way to personalize the new membership cards, issuing cards to the primary member and their spouses. Cards will have each person's name. They won't be issued to children however. National was spending about \$120,000.00 per year on the old cards, which they can no longer afford.

Chapter L won the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter "Git-R-Done" award for membership retention & recruitment for division 5. Andy Andrea won a "OH=6K+" pin for recruiting

new members. We will present the pin to Andy at the next meeting.

The Ohio traveling plaque, which was retired a while ago, is being replaced with a new program called "The Passport" to promote relations between chapters in their own section. The rules are too lengthy to go into here. We'll describe it in full at the January meeting.

If you get your Cabin Fever registration in by December 31<sup>st</sup>, you'll be entered in an early bird drawing for free hotel stay and registration fees and a box of chocolates.

That's about it on the officers meeting. Please let me know if you have questions on any of this. We'll cover most of it at the January meeting as well.

The 2006 ride & event schedule is ready to go. I posted it on the chapter web site and copies will be available at the January meeting. Chili Dump & dance flyers for 2006 are also posted there.

I would like to thank everyone who helped us with keeping the chapter running this past year. Some of our staff has elected to step down, with our heartfelt thanks, and some new folks are joining the staff for 2006. Anita and I are looking forward to another good year for Chapter L.

During November, we attended our first Ohio District officer's meeting in Columbus. It was a very informative meeting for the 55 Ohio GWRRA chapters attending. Almost half of the attendees were newly appointed Chapter Directors and Assistants. Roger Hurley and staff made several announcements that affect all Ohio members. We were informed that National will be replacing the "family of" membership cards with revised more personal cards. When available (within the next 4 - 6 months) the cards will be mailed with your renewal membership. Also, the Level 4 program has been reinstated and there will not be any fees for participation in Levels 2, 3 or 4; however, there will still be a cost for any level patches and pins. ## Historian

The "politically correct" trend today seems to be the "Holiday Season," but it is really the Christmas Season for so many of us! As I look at one of the familiar icons of the Christmas Season, I see Santa Clause all dressed in red with a big white beard and with a bottle in his hand. Here is the history on that subject. Dozens of artists portrayed Santa in a wide range of styles, sizes, and colors, including Norman Rockwell on *Saturday Evening Post* covers. But it was in the 1930s that the now familiar American Santa image solidified. A man named Haddon Sundblom began thirty-five years of Coca-Cola Santa advertisements, which finally established Santa as an icon of contemporary commercial culture. This

Santa was life-sized, jolly, and wearing the now familiar red suit. He appeared in magazines, on billboards, and shop counters encouraging Americans to see Coca-Cola as the solution to "a thirst for all seasons." Can you imagine the ad for Coke was the reason the jolly one is in RED!

This commercial success has led to the North American Santa Claus being exported around the world where he threatens to overcome the European St. Nicholas, who has retained his identity as a Christian bishop and saint. It's been a long journey from the Fourth Century Bishop of Myra, St. Nicholas, who showed his devotion to God in extraordinary kindness and generosity, to America's jolly Santa Claus. However, if you peel back the accretions he is still Nicholas, Bishop of Myra, whose caring surprises continue to model true giving and faithfulness.

## Candy Cane



The Candy Cane used during the holidays, stands as an important Christmas symbol. The color white symbolizes the purity and sinless nature of Jesus. Next, three small stripes to symbolize pain inflicted upon Jesus before his death on the cross and a bold stripe to represent the blood he shed for mankind.

Two other symbols are distinctive on the Candy Cane. When looked at, it looks like a Shepard's staff because Jesus is the Shepard of man. Then if we turn it upside down, we will notice the shape of the letter J symbolizing the first letter in Jesus' name. These five symbols were incorporated into this piece of peppermint stick so that we would remember what we really celebrate the Christmas season.

During the 1670's a German choirmaster had the sugar sticks bent into a shepherd's staff and passed out to children attending the Christmas services. This holiday custom spread throughout Europe and fancies canes, decorated with roses, were used as Christmas decorations in many homes.
