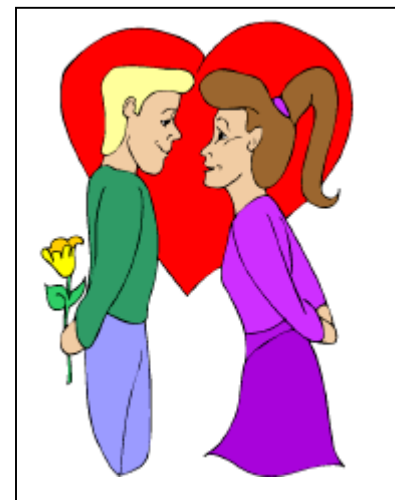

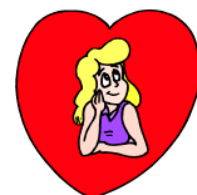

Lent is upon us and it's time to withdraw from the Epicurean delights we have been enjoying since Thanksgiving and up to Fat Tuesday. This recipe is a great Atkins Diet dish. Also, what better place to find sausage than in Porkopolis! I'm sure that each of you has your favor source for seasoned weenies.

Bon Appetit!

Roasted Sausage & Peppers

3T olive oil
2T balsamic vinegar
1t Italian seasoning
1/2t salt
1/4t black pepper
1-1/2# sweet Italian sausage or whatever you like
3 med. bell peppers (1 red, 1 yellow, 1 green) - cored & quartered
2 Ed onions - cut into 6 wedges
2 lg. zucchini peeled & cut into 1" pieces



Preheat your oven to 425 degrees. Spray a baking pan with nonstick spray. Place the sausage and veggies in the pan. Combine the oil, vinegar, seasoning, S&P in a bowl. Pour this mixture over the meat & veggies. Toss the veggies and sausage to coat and spread out evenly. Bake for 30 minutes. Turn the meat and veggies and baste with the pan juices. Roast an additional 15-20 minutes or until the sausage is cooked through. Serves 6 or 2-3 Gold Wingers!
