We choose to accept this additional risk because we love to ride and because we enjoy the many close friends we've made though the social aspects of the organization. If you choose to reduce your risks in life to an absolute minimum and forego these kinds of activities are you really living?

Anita and I were deeply affected by both of these accidents but we are going to continue to ride and stay active. Some of the best times we've ever had have been on rides with our chapter friends and we're not ready for that to end.

Other Items...The chapter dance went well this year. Attendance was down from previous years and so was revenue. We may have to look at other fund-raising options to cover the shortfall.

The 20<sup>th</sup> birthday shirts have sold well this year. We are talking with our embroidery supplier about offering a long-sleeve version for the fall and winter. Please see Tom or Barb Burns if you are interested in purchasing any of Chapter L's logo-wear.

### Rider Education & Motorist Awareness

By the time this article is published the guys who signed up to join me on the Stag Ride

should be enjoying some great twisty roads on our weekend route. Personally, I am really looking forward to this ride since I have been unable to participate in most of the chapter rides and events this year due to my employment at "The Happy Place." Hopefully we will get to enjoy some great roads, weather, food and company.

Last month I referred to the book written by David L. Hough - *Proficient Motorcycling – The Ultimate Guide to Riding Well*. Another topic that is covered well in the book is about how our eyes work and

why it is so important to take good care of them – especially for those of us who ride motorcycles. I didn't know that every eye has a small blind spot, usually off to one side of center. Luckily the blind spot of our left eye doesn't overlap with the blind spot of our right eye so that both eyes working together enable us to cover our whole field of vision. It is a good reason to keep our head and eyes moving when on the road and to always keep our face shield and windshield clean.

Another reason to not overlook that trip to the ophthalmologist

is that as we grow older we have a tendency to develop cataracts, floaters lose peripheral vision and sometimes the ability to distinguish colors. Sometimes night vision is diminished and if that is the case then it is important to make the smart decision and don't ride after dark.

Our eyes adjust to bright light by closing down the iris to limit the amount of light that can enter the eye. But the vision receptors in the back of the eye also adjust chemically and that can sometimes take a while. That means that our eyes do not adjust immediately to a change from bright light to dark to bright light again. Think about what happens when someone takes a flash picture of you and how the light temporarily blinds you. The same thing happens when we ride at night and the headlights of an oncoming vehicle confront us. As the vehicle passes it may take a few seconds for our eyes to adjust to the darkness and leave us temporarily blinded to oncoming road hazards. The thing to do as the oncoming vehicle gets closer is to temporarily shift our focus to the outside white line along the right edge of the road. It may be unnerving to do this but our peripheral vision keeps track of the oncoming vehicle and focusing our eyes away from the oncoming light and on the white line helps us maintain our lane position yet keeps us from being temporarily blinded and able to see the road ahead in the dark.

Another characteristic of the human eye is that it judges the distance of some colors differently. Did you know that it is more difficult to judge the distance from you to a red light than say that of a green one? Since taillights are red it sometimes

helps to count your following distance in seconds rather than just relying on your eye to tell you how far away you are from the vehicle in front of you. At night it is recommended that you avoid following another vehicle any closer than 4 seconds.

Don't forget to mark your calendars to submit your renewals for the Rider Ed. Levels program. All renewals are due January 1<sup>st</sup>. There are forms on the table at the back of the room or see me (or Pat) if you need assistance. There is nothing more important than making a personal commitment to Rider Education! Hope to see you at Chapter L's next meeting on October 19<sup>th</sup>.
