# Chapter L's Educator

Here we are in February and the motorcycle sits in the garage just waiting for us to crank it up and go. We have a year-round riding season if you take into consideration that with the proper gear we can ride all year. So, what is the secret? When the temperature slides below 32 degrees, I will usually skip the ride. I will not ride when there is ice, snow or salt or sand on the roads. However, when the mercury inches up above that number I will want to be out there on two wheels with caution and a change in my riding gear.

One thing with cold weather riding is hypothermia. Riding your motorcycle at highway speeds in cold weather, or even cool weather, can deplete a motorcycle rider's body heat and leave him chilled very quickly. It may start with the chills and then you may start getting numb fingers and face. Very quickly you have the ingredients for full blown hypothermia before one realizes.

When temperatures are below 60 degrees it is wise to dress in layers. When the temperatures dip even lower, thermal underwear and/or chaps keep feet and knees flexible and ready to function. Thermal socks and ski-sock liners help keep toes all nice and cozy. Larger sporting goods stores such as Dick's or even Bass Pro Shops offer a variety in various weights of outer and underwear. A well-designed winter riding suit that is made especially for motorcycling is a welcome addition to any rider's closet. My personal answer to the cold weather riding situation is either Gerbing or Widder electric clothing. Jacket liners, pants, socks and gloves will keep you warm, so consider these if you are prone to ride in the cooler months.

When the temperature is below 60 degrees, before your ride on the interstate highway, pull out your handy dandy wind chill factor chart and see where the chill factor is when you are riding at 65 miles per hour and you will find it feels like 39 degrees! Yes, that is the wind chill factor. The Gold Book published this chart starting a number of years ago.

I never realized how much the flip shield Nolan helmet helps keep the face warm until I started using that style helmet a few years ago. In very chilly weather I will also use a balaclava and a

portable turtleneck that kinda looks like a "bib" ... and that works to keep the chin and throat warm. Your co-rider should be given the same clothing choices or more, since they often don't get the same protection from the fairing that the rider does, especially on a GL1800.

Be extremely cautious of intersections when riding since there could be excessive amounts of sand and other ice control grit, including salt at that location. One of our Assistant District Rider Educators here in Ohio had a mishap at an intersection recently. Melanie Geggie, a long time rider and Master Tour Rider had her Wing slide out from under her and put her in the hospital. Two surgeries later she is now out of the hospital and on the road to recovery. It is unknown what happened to cause the accident but it still happened to a very experienced rider. Stay alert and ride safe.

If you were at the January meeting you certainly remember Deputy Roy and Pokey. I hope after gaining your composure from laughing, you realized the message was about dollars and not beans. In our chapter we relate most things to riding, but you need to know that to keep Chapter L a viable chapter it is not a "free ride."

Our expenses per month average about \$250 if no additional costs or reimbursements occur. To date our average donation per month is \$85-\$100. So if you relate that to riding, sooner or later you're going to be on the side of the road out of gas. If you go to get a can of gas and find you have no money or credit card, you will have to rely on a friend riding with you to give you a couple of bucks. Well, as a

Club we need those bucks too. We are relying on all of you, our members.

Recently, the Ways & Means committee met to discuss how to more effectively finance Chapter L. We decided on four facts the members need to know.

Fact 1: You need to know we have expenses and they have to be paid by the members. Currently, some members donate a lot and some donate none. We would suggest everyone try to donate something each month according to your means.
