# Chapter L's Educator

## Have You Renewed Your Rider Education Level?

Good News! The renewal fees for all levels have been suspended. The suspension of renewal fees also covers those participants who are not current at their level, according to Bob Lorenz, Senior International Rider Education Director. The only cost is two dollars each for renewal hanger and pins, which can be purchased through your Region, District, or Chapter Educator.

Several of our Chapter "L" members have asked, "What are these Rider Ed Levels?" The following is an explanation of each Rider Education Level:

**Level I - Safe Miles (Safety by Commitment)** the only requirement for Level I is current membership and the expressed commitment of the rider/co-rider to strive for and practice safe riding.

**Level II - Tour Rider/Co-Rider (Safety by Education).** The requirements for level II are that you Must be a current GWRRA member, be enrolled in Level I, have at least 5000 safe miles, have a current motorcycle license endorsement (rider), and have completed an approved Rider course (Co-Riders seminar) in the past three years.

**Level III - Certified Tour rider/co-rider (Safety by Preparedness).** The requirements for Level III are that you Must be a current GWRRA member, be enrolled in Level II, be current in Level III requirements, maintain current First Aid or CPR or MFA certifications, and carry a first aid kit in your bike.

**Level IV - Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider (Safety by Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness).** The requirements for Level IV are that you Must be a current GWRRA member, be enrolled in Level III, be current in Level III for one year, have a minimum of 25000 safe miles, have completed an approved Rider course (Co-Rider seminar) in the past three years, maintain current First Aid and CPR or MFA certifications, wear protective riding gear at all times while riding, and carry a first aid kit in your bike.

A benefit to the GWRRA Rider Education Program is that many motorcycle insurance companies give
