Becoming a Better Rider. GWRRA offers the levels programs, which help us gain:

- ❖ Increase rider knowledge

- ❖ Increase rider safety skills
- ❖ Prevention of accidents
- ❖ Reduced injuries
- ❖ Reduced fatalities
- ❖ Improve general public imagine of motorcycling
- ❖ Enhance enjoyment of motorcycle riding

How can we do all this? Get involve in the levels program with GWRRA

Level I - Safety by Commitment

Level I of the Rider Education Levels Program represent the commitment of the Rider and/or Co-Rider to practice and encourage safe motorcycle operation whenever they operate their motorcycle. Every successful accomplishment begins with a commitment to reach the intended objective. This is true of the Rider Education Levels Program and includes a promise to learn for the benefit of Rider, Co-Rider, friends and family and others on the road. No prerequisites or minimums to meet

Level II - Safety by Education

Level II of the Rider Education Levels Program represents the continuing commitment of the Rider and/or Co-Rider to be safer motorcyclists by completing approved motorcycle training at regular intervals in order to build and maintain optimum riding skills and awareness. Must be active Level I participant Achieve at least 5000 safe riding miles since becoming a GWRRA member Take an approved riding/co-rider training course within the past 2 years

Level III - Safety by Preparedness

Level III of the Rider Education Levels Program represents the commitment of the Rider and/or Co-Rider to be prepared in the event of and accident to give aid and possibly save lives. This is achieved by becoming knowledgeable in First Aid or CPR through training and by carrying a first aid kit on their motorcycle at all times. Must be current in Level II Have CPR or First Aid training certification. Carry First Aid kit on your bike

Level IV - Safety by Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness

Level IV is the most prestigious level within the Rider Education Levels Program and is referred to as Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider. It represents the highest level of commitment by the Rider and/or Co-Rider toward safe riding and preparedness. This commitment is shown by a demonstrated history of safe miles, continuing education and current certification in **both** First Aid **and** CPR. Level IV of the Rider Education Levels Program was designed for those special caring individuals who desire to "be all they can be" with regards to motorcycle safety. The requirements are more stringent than Level III and require a greater commitment. It is realized that Level IV is not for everyone, but for those who desire to

be of greater service to their fellow man, it is the correct prescription. Must be current in Level III Must have ridden at least 25,000 safe miles since becoming GWRRA member Complete an approved Rider Training course within the past year Certified in both CPR and First Aid Co-riders must meet same requirements with substitution of Co-rider seminar or 2-Up riding course

If anyone has any questions about your current level status, please see Jim or myself. We can help you get current and help guide you through increasing your level in the program.

up river displaying their glory in front of Cincinnati's Public Landing. Light snacks and live musical entertainment will be offered. Tall Stacks cruise and event pass tickets have arrived for Sunday October 8th. At the September 20th Chapter L meeting tickets will be distributed to those that prepaid. Event passes will be on sale for \$10.00. Please store your tickets in a safe place until the event. We can not replace lost or stolen tickets. A map of the Serpentine Wall showing the location for the Harriett Bishop Boat will be available for everyone that has a cruise ticket. Be sure to have lunch or breakfast before the cruise. The cruise has appetizers only! The Cruise will begin boarding at 2:15PM and leave the dock at 2:45PM. Everyone should be in the line for boarding no later than 1:30PM to ensure that you do not miss the boat. Although there is a seat number on the ticket, the cruise is open seating. Be sure to wear comfortable shoes and dress for the weather. This is a rain or shine event. If you want additional information about Tall Stacks, go to www.tallstacks.com or www.gototown.com. These websites give details about handicapped parking and general parking. Plan to car pool to save on parking. Sawyer Point Parking at Eggleston and Pete Rose Way is reasonable but fills up early for events. "Our exhibition is about response - the response of people at the time, and the response of men, women and children today - to the events of five years ago, as well as the meaning of those events in their personal lives" said Dr. Spencer
