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## HOT CHICKY SANDWICHES

- 4 to 6 chicken breasts (or you can use turkey)
- 1 can chicken broth (I like to use garlic flavored and then I don't add the garlic later.)
- 1 1/2 to 2 cans Cream of Chicken Soup (I use 2)
- 1 small can evaporated milk (if I don't have that on hand, I sometimes use regular milk.)
- 1/2 can broth from cooking the chicken
- 2 to 4 teaspoons minced garlic
- 3 to 5 pieces of bread

Cook chicken in broth until tender, then shred. Stir in cream of chicken soup, milk, broth, and garlic. Break bread into pieces and add to chicken until you have the desired consistency. I also add lots of pepper. This can be served as sandwiches or over noodles or even a baked potato.

## Chapter Educator

### Make yourself a better rider:

**High speed Steering.** Above about 15-20 mph the motorcycles wheels act like gyroscopes. These spinning masses of wheel and tire combine to create a gyroscopic force. If you've ever held a spinning bicycle wheel in your hand and felt how difficult it is to steer it, you understand. So how do we overcome this force to get our bike to turn?

**We don't. Use the force:** If you've ever played with a spinning gyroscope, you'll remember that pushing forward on the left end of the axle didn't result in the wheel turning to the right. Instead, thanks to a force called gyroscopic precession, which redirects the force 90 degrees in the direction of rotation, the wheel actually leaned to the left, rotating on an axis around the center of the wheel. This same gyroscopic action will cause your bike to lean to the left. This is call counter-steering. Turn the bars right, and you lean left. It is the only way a motorcycle steers at any speed above walking speeds. Those of you saying, "no way, I never do it that way" are wrong. This is why so many motorcyclists actually steer into an accident. They try and turn to avoid an incident by turning the front wheel to point to the right. This in turn steers them left and straight into the accident. So whether you realize it or not you are doing it, better known as counter-steering.

**Controlling a bike in a turn.** When the bike is at a desired lean angle, ease up on the bars and the bike will remain. If you let up on the throttle the bike

will turn in, and conversely adding throttle will make the bike run wider. To straighten the bike up, add a smooth combination of throttle and reverse steering input. If you are in a left-hand turn, turn the bars farther to the left, and the bike will stand up.

Some ask how hard to push. Please understand that this is not a sharp jab at the bar. It is a smooth steady pressure with the key word being smooth. The higher the speed at which the bike is traveling, the more gyroscopic effect there is, therefore, you will need to push harder. This is why road racers work on upper body strength so much.

**Why counter-steering.** Imagine yourself cruising down the highway on a beautiful spring day. Suddenly you see (insert your worst nightmare) in the road, covering the right two-thirds of your lane. If you do not consciously understand and use counter-steering, you will probably push on the right bar in an attempt to steer left like you would on a slow moving bicycle or car where you steer left to go left. Pushing on the right will steer you directly into the object. The correct action here would be to push on the left bar and steer away from the obstacle. So remember. **Push left, turn left. Push right, turn right.** Once you get the hang of it, counter-steering will become instinctive--your body probably knows how to do it, it's just your mind that is lagging. Understanding the principles behind counter-steering will make you smoother and give you a better feeling of control over your environment. It may also save your life. Like any safety technique, it only works if you practice. Unless the action is second nature, you will return to your old habits during an emergency. So practice, practice, practice.

## "Yummo" Zip-lock Bag Recipes

### Omelet

- ✓ 2 large or extra large eggs per person
- ✓ Water, salt & pepper
- ✓ Add-ins - ham, cheese, bacon, onions, peppers, etc.
- ✓ Quart size freezer Ziploc baggie.

Bring a large 8-quart pot of water to a rolling boil. Have each person write his or her name, use permanent ink, on the baggie. Break only 2 eggs, no more or less into the baggie. Add a splash of water. Salt & pepper to taste. Seal the Ziploc bag. Squish bag to break up the eggs. Shake the bag until all is blended. Pick your favorite add-ins. Dump them into the bag with the egg. Squish bag to mix in add-ins. Zip bag closed making sure all the air is out.

Place bags into the boiling water for 13 minutes. About 6 bags at a time will fit. After *exactly* 13 minutes, carefully remove the bags from the water. Slide out your very own perfect personalized omelet. Throw away the zip bag once it is emptied. Do not use it again.

### Fruit Smoothies

- ✓ Cool Whip
- ✓ peach halves
- ✓ cinnamon graham crackers
- ✓ bananas or Any other soft fruit
- ✓ Ziploc sandwich bags

Put 2 heaping tablespoons of Cool Whip into a sandwich bag. Add 1 peach half, half a banana and half of a graham cracker. Make up your smoothie to

your taste. This is just an idea to get you started. Let the air out of the bag and close. Squeeze everything together until smooth. Bite a corner of the bag off and slurp the smoothie right from the bag!

### Fudge in a Bag

- ✓ 1/2 cup cocoa powder
- ✓ 1 box confectioner's sugar
- 1 stick of margarine or butter
- ✓ 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3 oz cream cheese
- ✓ gallon freezer Ziploc bag

Add all ingredients into a bag and seal without most of the air. Pass bag around and let everybody help mix it up by squeezing it for 30 minutes. Fudge can be served out of bag or spread in pan and cut to serve.

### Camp Pudding

- ✓ 2 large boxes instant pudding mix. Use the packages of pudding that use 3 cups milk or get 3 smaller packages.
- ✓ 2 cups instant dry milk
- 1 small package Graham crackers
- 2 (1 gal) ziploc bags
- ✓ 8-10 small Dixie cups or about 24 bathroom sized cups.

Put the dry pudding power into a zip bag. Add 2 cups dry milk and mix well. Add 6 cups water to the pudding and milk mixture. Close the bag and shake to mix without breaking the bag. Crush the graham crackers in a second zip bag. Put crumbs in the bottom of cups. Pour pudding over the crumbs (cut 1 corner of bag off to pipe over crumbs). Top the pudding with additional crumbs. Let set for a few minutes in the refrigerator.
