The month of May has been designated as "Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month" by many government, national, state and local motorcycle and vehicle organizations. Here it is the month of May and the year is off to a great start and rounding the curve and running down the backstretch of the year of 2008. Well with the Kentucky Derby this month, I got a little carried away! Sorry! The month of May is always a time for some motorcyclists to be getting their motorcycles out of the garage and tuning up their riding skills at one of the Ohio GWRRA Rider Education promoted Skills Days. We attended the one in Xenia and did it 2 up again.

May is also Motorcycle Awareness Month so, as automobile drivers as well as motorcycle riders, you have to make yourselves be seen by others on the road. I am hoping that our chapter Ride Educator, Dave Heim will cover this subject in his Rider Ed Report at the meeting.

Still on the subject of motorcycle awareness but taking a quick detour back to last month --- while on the way to the Tennessee Rally the last weekend in April, we noticed that through Kentucky the overhead electronic signs for "Motorcycle Safety Week - Share the Road." I have seen no signs like this in Ohio.

The Tennessee Rally was soggy again this year as many riders from Ohio made their way down to Pigeon Forge to rally and ride. We saw several from SW Ohio Chapters there and we had lunch one day with our CD Roy & Kathy who were staying in Gatlinburg. Ohio was the largest District out of Region N with 65 or so present.

Let's get back to the month of May activities. Something that I thought may be appropriate is the idea of a "Shamrock" ride. No we will not be going out and looking for shamrocks or clovers. Here is an explanation of that Memorial Day Weekend ride.

There will be 3 days and each day we plan to cover one of three leaves of the imaginary shamrock. Each of the three days we will plan on “leaving” from Wendy’s Restaurant in Miamitown, OH so that will be the stem of the Shamrock. Rain will cancel ride on a day by day basis.

We will depart at 9 AM on Saturday to Kentucky, (note this changed from 11 AM) 10 AM on Sunday in Ohio and 9 AM on Monday to Indiana. You will be able to spend each evening in your own home instead of paying for a motel in some far away location. You can have breakfast and your evening meal at your own home if you prefer. We will have lunch somewhere on the ride. Our routes are to be back road scenic with some limited expressway riding. The routes are still being developed and I hope to have them completed soon. If you have other plans during that weekend you can ride one or two days and not the others or ride all three days – whatever fits your schedule. More on this at our May meeting.

Although I do not really need a sign up sheet there will be one at our May meeting. The reason is that I would like to know an approximation of how many will be able to make this ride due to lunch considerations. So, if you plan on going, PLEASE sign up at the table at the rear of the room.

Chapter Educator **By Dave Heim**

Tips on Pulling Your Trailer

This month’s main topic is about bike trailers. I know I have talked about this subject before. But as a reminder to us older riders and our new members who have not heard this, here it is again. The first thing you need is a good hitch securely fastened to the bike. Make sure the coupler ball or spindle on the hitch is sitting on the centerline of the rear tire. This is important. If it is off center you will have some very adverse handling issues. Next you need a good trailer with a good coupler. Make sure the coupler is in good shape and adjusted properly so it can’t come off the ball or spindle when latched. Check by lifting the tongue of the trailer while latched. Most, if not all couplers have a provision for a lock. Use a lock when it is coupled to the bike.

This will prevent the latch from accidentally becoming unlatched when pulling it. It’s no fun dragging an unhitched trailer behind you.

Next make sure the trailer has safety chains. All states except West Virginia require safety chains. The chains must be securely fastened and not separate when you stand on them. Some law enforcement check them in this manner. The chains should be long enough so they don’t impede when the bike or trailer is turned but also short enough they are not close to the ground. Remember if the trailer decides to take a trip on it’s own you are responsible for any damage or accidents it causes. Hook them up by crossing them to form a cradle under the tongue. If the trailer should come off the hitch the cradle will catch and hold up the tongue thus help prevent the tongue from digging into the pavement.

Next is loading the trailer. Put the heavier items over the axle and distribute the rest of the weight front and rear to get the proper tongue weight. Usually, lighter items to the front. The tongue weight should not exceed 15% of the total or gross weight of the trailer. Ideally you want 7% to 10% of the gross weight. You can look in the trailer manual or tag to find the weight of your trailer. Then weigh your cargo as you are loading it. Add these 2 weights together to get gross weight. You can use a bathroom scale with a two by four long enough so you can stand the 2X4 upright on the scale and the trailer tongue on top of the 2X4. The trailer and tongue should be level. Read the scales. This is your true tongue weight. Move the weight in the trailer to get the desired tongue weight. Tongue weight is critical to how the bike and trailer handles. Too much tongue weight will cause excessive weight on the rear suspension so when you brake the trailer will push down on the back of the bike taking weight off the front wheel causing reduced braking on the front wheel. Too little tongue weight during braking will lift the back of the bike taking weight off the rear wheel. This will increase the chances of skidding the rear tire. Not Good.

Make sure your wheel bearings are packed with grease and properly adjusted. Make sure the bearing are not rusted and pitted or otherwise messed up. Check the tires for proper inflation. Grease the ball on the hitch. This will make the coupler and ball last longer as well as giving you a better ground on the electrical system. Check the lights for proper operation and you’re good to go.
