## **Chapter Educator** **By Dave Heim**

### **Where Do The Hazards Come From?**

In 1981 “The Hurt” Study was funded by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and researcher Harry Hurt of the University of Southern California, investigated almost every aspect of 900 motorcycle accidents in the Los Angeles area. Additionally, Hurt and his staff analyzed 3,600 motorcycle traffic accident reports in the same geographic area.

Even today the study is still quoted by rider education origination such as the MSF. One part of the study found that positioning in an intersection is crucial in maximizing your visibility. The majority of the accidents came from the 11 to 1 o'clock area.

When approaching an intersection try to position yourself in an area where you are more visible. In the case of a vehicle about to make a left turn (12 o'clock) and you are coming toward the intersection you want to be closest to the center lane so the oncoming vehicle can see you.

Another position to make you visible is by keeping the distance from the vehicle in front of you. That is, when you go through the intersection you do not want to be seen as a part of the vehicle that just went through, but as an independent vehicle and allow the other vehicles at the intersection to recognize you.

Just remember, that the drivers that are looking in the 11, 12, and 1 o'clock position can't see you. Another thing to remember is that motorcycles can disappear in traffic because they're smaller and harder to spot among other, larger vehicles. Whether you wear brightly colored gear or not, smart positioning is critical in making your presence known to other drivers.
